Ms. Badynee completed her Masters in Linguistics with a Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL) specialization at Oakland University in the Department of Linguistics. She completed the following courses that I teach in the TESL Program: ALS 518 Teaching Methods for Second Language Learning, ALS 519 TESL Practicum, and ALS 517 Second Language Acquisition. In addition, I was the first reader for her LIN 680 Seminar paper. These courses present past and current methodology used in second language teaching, theory, practice and assessment and the opportunity to teach a class of ESL students for one semester (ALS 519). Participants in the Graduate TESL Specialization Program are required to create a curriculum, authentic assessments, and daily lesson plans that can be used to teach listening, speaking, reading and writing skills at all proficiency levels.

While taking ALS 518 Teaching Methods for Second Language Learning, Ms. Badynee was required to create lesson plans that could be used in an ESL classroom to teach speaking, listening, reading comprehension, and writing. Her lessons were always clear and concise and she devised activities that encouraged every student to be involved in single, pair, or group activities. Her creative lesson plans demonstrated her ability to differentiate her teaching and to truly address the needs of every student in her classroom.
